**20/128. Ashby Road TRO:** No objections recorded to proposed speed reduction on Ashby Road from 60mph to 40mph for new residential estate.

**20/129. St John's Closed Churchyard:** Conservation Works Area notice issued, two out of three written quotes received, Clerk to ascertain exactly what quotes cover to adequately make a comparison and ensure value for money. Yew tree not to be touched as it is too young, may need to train branches upwards with twine. Buddleia to be pollarded rather than removed. Young cherry tree may need replacing.

**20/130. Memorial Bench, Two Trees Close:** HM Land Registry revealed land belongs to crown, Gardening Club have maintained area for a considerable length of time. Memorial Bench now in place by Gardening Club, aesthetically pleasing to the village. No authority to give permission however no objection from PC.

20/131. Hopwas Maintenance: To discuss small items of general maintenance at the Playing Field:

- a) Fencing contract outcome Work completed, approved & signed off
- b) Addition of 'no climbing' signage to the vehicle gate at Nursery Lane Clerk to order
- c) Replacement bin To review bin in Playing Field in the next 12 months

Hopwas - Play equipment painted, Play bark replenished, Dog bags replenished, Litter Bin installed, Signage ordered due to be installed next week, Padlock fixed to both vehicle gates, Spring Rocker out of action, Basketball board still not arrived due end of September, Clerk will continue to chase.

Comberford Millennium Green in need of maintenance to pathways, benches, play tower and fencing. CMG trust to put together a plan of works for PC to consider.
